

Call for papers

Papers of the highest quality are invited from engineers for consideration for publication in The Structural Engineer. The aim is to advance knowledge of the subject globally. The Journal is published by the Institution of Structural Engineers, which is the only professional society and qualifying body in the world concerned solely with the theory and practice of structural engineering, and is renowned worldwide for its exacting standards.

The Structural Engineer is produced twice monthly. Papers are published subject to peer review and provide structural engineers worldwide with information on practice, design, development and research, education and training associated with the profession.

We aim to strike a balance between papers reporting research and those addressing the challenges faced in professional practice. Our reach is global and we aim to publish more papers of international relevance.

Once accepted by reviewers authors can expect papers to be published within 5 months. While the material is normally expected to be original, papers presented at conferences can be considered subject to copyright clearance and peer review: authors may be asked to rewrite for our readership.

Relevant papers may be placed in themed issues which appear once a month covering such subjects as concrete, structural steel, timber, bridges, fire engineering, monitoring repair and refurbishment, risk, health & safety, sustainability and information technology (see annual features list on the website). We are also interested in papers on a variety of other topics including historical aspects, specific projects worldwide, monitoring and maintenance, innovation; indigenous construction methods and appropriate technologies as best practice in different countries, global issues etc.

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
