Young members are a bridge between education and real world experience. In 2025 we have captured upcoming developments to our industry and introduced key topics to students and young engineers through site visits, technical talks and workshops.

Highlights of our site visits are the breadth of projects we have given our members, offering practical insight into different construction methodologies. These spanned 200 year old building refurbishments and tall concrete structures to steel framed healthcare structures, stadium expansions and more. These allow us to give the students and young engineers an appreciation of the details they see in the classroom.

Further connecting to students, the group ran an event in May called 'Meet an Engineer', an evening where

six young professionals were invited to give talks to 50 students on what obstacles they faced in their early years of engineering and how they overcame them. This was followed by two hours of networking where students could ask the engineers their burning questions about the industry.

We have also hosted a snap and sketch competition, an event themed upon regeneration where our members photographed a derelict area and marked/sketched upon the structures they think would bring back social and economic value. A great success off the back of the two further sketching events held in 2025.

Finally, there have been numerous technicals talks with a diverse set of topics. The success of the North West could not be without the long list of speakers giving up their time for us this year.

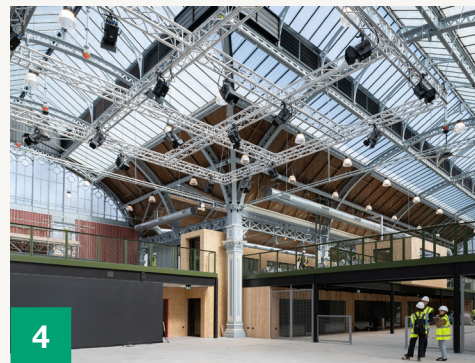

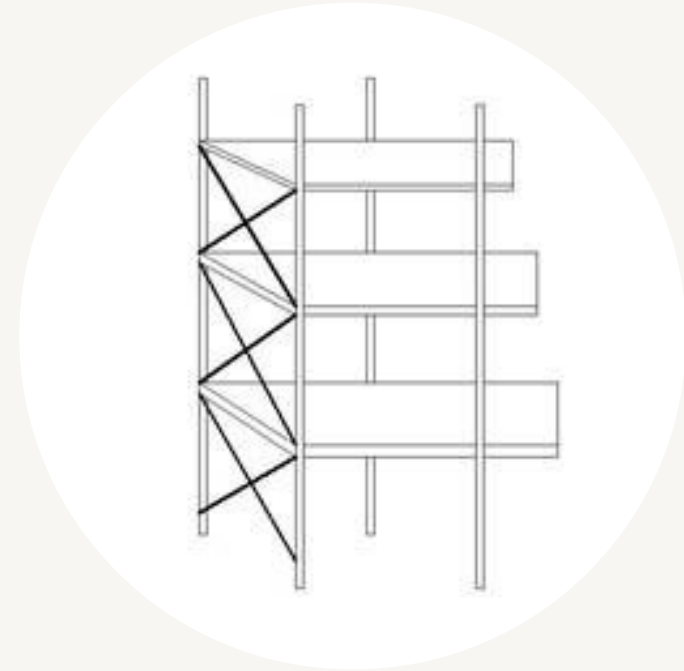
